For out of Zion shall go the law, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. ⁴He shall judge between the nations, and shall decide disputes for many peoples; and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore. ⁵O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the LORD.

HISTORY OF ADVENT

In A.D. 581 the Council of Macon decreed that between St. Martin's Day (November 11) and Epiphany (January 6) the second, fourth, and sixth days of the week were days of fasting. It seems as though advent was a kind of "Winter-Lent", a solemn, penitential season, Marriage could not be performed during this time. Ecclesiastically the color was violet, the same as the color of Lent. Finally, in A.D. 590 Gregory the Great established the four Sundays before Christmas as Advent, a practice which has remained to the present.
