Bible Truth ~ Keep your eyes on Jesus, he is with you always.

Bible Verse ~ But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid." Matthew 14:27

~ Note this is right after Jesus Feeds the 5000, some of the people wanted to make Jesus their earthly king. Jesus, came to be our heavenly King, our Savior from sin.

~ This story shows that even the disciples occasionally doubted. Do you have doubts and fears in your life? No one's faith is perfect. If you do stumble, if you ever have a doubt talk to Jesus about it.

~ Lots of situations are too big or too scary for us to handle, but nothing is too big for Jesus! What a blessing you have! You are a child of the creator of the universe who has power over all things.

Trust in the Lord

Matthew 14:25-33

Could there be anything more powerful then an earthquake, tornado, floods, winds, and other disasters. Yes even Covid-19! -

Yes. The power of God. God is powerful enough to shake the heavens and the earth. He is powerful enough to create our world and each of us in it. His love for us is powerful enough to move God to send His Son, Jesus, to die and rise in triumph so that our sins are forgiven.

The God of all power has chosen you to be His child. He sent His Son to defeat our greatest enemies-sin, death, and the devil. He gives you the power to face the things that may cause you to be afraid.

In our Bible lesson today, Jesus walked on the water. When Peter saw Jesus, he made his way to Jesus after Jesus called him out of the boat. When Peter kept his focus on Jesus, he was able to walk on the water. When Peter focused on his own fears and insecurities instead of Jesus, he began to sink and drown.

This happens in out lives too. When things are going well in our life, it is very easy to keep our eyes on Jesus and float along. However, when the winds of life interfere with what we're doing, it isn't as easy to stay focused on Jesus. We find ourselves terrified and panicked by the problems that we have in our lives, just like Peter did. It is only through the Holy Spirit's action that we are called by the Gospel and lifted up so that we can float once more. When Jesus is kept as our center, we do not risk sinking but stay afloat.

Prayer: Dear heavenly Father, help us trust in You, even when we face hardships. Help us to remember that we can face the problems that we have and overcome them with the help of Your Son, Jesus Christ. We will never be alone because we know that You are always with us, guiding and keeping us afloat, even in the heart of the storm. In the name of Jesus we pray. Amen.



Tracing the Lord's Prayer

Use your finger to trace the shape of the cross as you pray the Lord's Prayer.

The TEN COMMANDMENTS

- 1.You shall have no other gods.
- 2. You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God.
- Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.
- 4. Honor your father and your mother.
- 5. You shall not murder.
- 6. You shall not commit adultery.
- 7. You shall not steal.
- 8. You shall not give false witness against your neighbor.
- 9. You shall not covet our neighbor's house.
- 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.

Making and using a pray jar, journal, etc.



These are examples of some fancy prayer jars, but they can be as simple or as complicated as you want. If you made a basket in VBS you can use that or some people use a notebook to record their prayers. The important thing is how you use it.

Gather some scraps of paper and write, specific prayers, positive sayings, things to be thankful for, or names of community groups you would like to pray for. You can even write Bible verses to remind you of why we pray.

Examples:

- Name a positive event that happened to you this year
- Share one prayer you have seen answered
- Give an example of a blessing God has given you
- Pray for a family member in need

Place in your Prayer Jar.

When you need help with your burdens or feel very blessed go to your prayer jar or journal and remember the blessings God has given you. Pray and place the burden or the blessing in your jar.
